

## Indiana Publicly Funded Adult Vaccine Eligibility Statement

Effective Date: July 1, 2011

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### Adult Vaccine Program Eligibility Guide

Adult, 19 years of age and older

Must fulfill the requirements listed under **BOTH** Requirement 1 (Financial Need) & Requirement 2 (Risk Category).

Must have no private health insurance coverage for vaccines and are not Medicaid eligible. If Medicaid eligible or other health program covered, use private stock and bill to appropriate source.

<b>Requirement 1 – Financial Need</b>				
<b>Eligibility Category</b>	<b>Medicaid</b>	<b>No Health Insurance</b>	<b>Insurance Does Not Pay</b>	<b>Fully Insured</b>
<b>Definition</b>	An adult who has any form of Medicaid insurance.	An adult who does <b>not</b> have health insurance.	An adult who have commercial (private) health insurance but the coverage does not include vaccines.	An adult who has health insurance which provides coverage for vaccines.
<b>Can they receive publicly funded vaccine?</b>	No Medicaid should be billed for the cost of the vaccine and administration fee.	Yes Refer to Requirement 2 for additional requirement	Yes Refer to Requirement 2 for additional requirement	No Private insurance should be billed for the cost of the vaccine and administration fee.

<b>Requirement 2 – Risk Category</b>	
<b>Vaccine</b>	<b>Risk Category</b>
<b>Hepatitis B*</b> (Single antigen)	Sexual/household contacts of person with chronic hepatitis B and/or C Men who have sex with men (MSM) Injection drug users (IDU's) Adult receiving health services at STD clinics, including those persons infected with hepatitis C
<b>Hepatitis A*</b> (Single antigen)	Sexual/household contacts of person with chronic hepatitis B and/or C Men who have sex with men (MSM) Persons infected with hepatitis B and/or C
<b>Tdap</b> (Not intended for routine Td Booster)	Parents and household members (who live in the same dwelling) of a infant under 12 months (1 year) of age
<b>School Required</b>	Any vaccination required by ISDH for School Entry to individuals 19 years and older, if they are still attending a high school (not college)

\*Twinrix will no longer be used as part of the Adult Vaccine Program.
